### **50 Years of Selling Apples** By Pam Mount

**SPRING 2025** 



o celebrate our 50th anniversary, I thought I would write about the story of selling apples. Gary and I bought Terhune Orchards 55-acre

main farm in 1975. We didn't know much about apple farming. It has been an adventure.

Central to the farmstead is our apple barn (still painted red), built 5 feet above the surrounding land. The basement was apple storage, with a stream running through it and out to a groundlevel pond. The stream kept the basement cool for the apples. This construction made sense 150 years ago, but not in 1975, so George and his brothers, who worked for Carrie Air Conditioning, upgraded to cold storage. The basement had stored a fair number of apple boxes, but not enough once we started planting more trees. New varieties and new types of trees turned out to be much more productive than the huge "old fashioned" trees that Mr. Terhune had planted. You can see some of these "antique" trees to the right of the driveway as you enter the farm.

Once the apples were hand-stacked in the basement and cooled, a huge door would open in the floor "upstairs" in the store and boxes of apples were pushed up and out. Then we sorted small, medium, and large of each variety and lined them up on the floor. We started with a cigar box to hold the money after selling some apples. Soon Gary's brother Tim found an old cash register with a crank on the side. After a few years, we bought a neat (modern) cash register that actually added and subtracted for you. Another thing we had to learn quickly was making apple cider. It seemed people loved Terhune Orchards' cider, but we had no idea how to make it. It didn't take Gary, his brother and friend long to arrange a renewed cider press and we were in business. Now we had more apples and cider to sell in our store and more customers. So, in 1985, we bought 27 acres of open land on Van Kirk Road, which we planted with new apple (continued on page 2)

# Ladders

ot long ago, at the beginning of winter, I had time to reflect on our winter work here at Terhune Orchards. It was also the time we were getting ready to

celebrate our 50th anniversary at the farm which we started here in 1975. And things are now sure different than they were. Nearly 100 percent of our original purchase had been planted in apples. Big trees, about 24 feet tall. And by the way, the trees where Terhune visitors now park are about 18 to 20 feet tall. These trees were planted at 30 trees per acre. Over the past years, trees have been removed and been replaced by other crops such as cherry, pear, peach, asparagus, blueberry, strawberry, flowers, blackberry, as well as by newer, more compact plantings of apples.

Finding the right types of ladders for pruning, thinning, and picking was difficult, 22 feet long was needed, strong but light enough to be carried from tree to tree. I had a favorite type of ladder made in New York, expensive, hard to find. And often damaged by trucking companies during delivery. Despite the negatives, these ladders were what we had to have. Pruning starts in December and finishes in April. Hard work — not so safe. In fact, once a curious driver ran off Cold Soil Road and knocked a worker from his ladder. Fortunately, no injury. But an unusual safety problem. I have replaced trees over the years, but my wife Pam asked that I remove no more big trees, save them for romance. Luckily, I have listened. The remaining big trees make a nice area for wine sales. We call it our Wine Orchard.

This winter has been a cold one. Fortunately, apple trees can withstand the near 0 temperatures that we have had. Blueberries, grapes, peach and blackberries are in the category of "maybe." We will wait and see. Too low winter temperatures can kill the fruit buds on these crops that are awaiting spring. Our pruning of these crops will be guided by careful analysis of possible bud damage. Fortunately, daughter Reuwai and her group of sharp-eyed helpers will assume this task. The past five to eight years damage was not so bad. Other times were severe. One winter, for Fortunately, we grow a great variety of crops with a great variety of winter hardiness. I'm often asked about winter damage to our crops. I answer as above.

Even though the big trees are mostly gone, there are still medium heights to be pruned. We have recently purchased a four-wheel drive self-propelled platform made by the ORSI company. From Italy, so great. We have found that Italian manufacturers are the most-clever in the whole world. Durability, not so much. We have had our problems. But all together, we get a lot of use out of our ORSI. The ladder and platform story is not, however, over. We have found new uses. Cherry, blueberry, blackberry and grape need to have bird netting stretched over the rows every year. As the crops ripen, bird damage becomes unacceptable. Cherries also need a plastic cover to keep rain from cracking the skins of the cherries as they ripen. The wooden ladders are not suitable. We cover 2 acres of blueberry, 3 acres of cherries and 9 acres of grapes every year using our ORSI!



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### What's Growing at Terhune Orchards

hen we say we have fresh vegetables all year long, we really mean it. We pick fresh crops daily all year. We overwinter crops in low tunnels, grow crops in high tunnels and grow crops in our greenhouses. To keep ourselves organized and our faithful customers supplied with fresh vegetables, we have over 700 separate entries in our planting plan so we can have sequential and properly planned plantings.

Over the years, we find that a variety of growing styles and range of different crop varieties helps ensure longer growing seasons and more reliable supply. While we are harvesting all year around, we get especially excited to see the early spring crops such as asparagus.
