Kite Day is our annual tradition to welcome spring at Terhune Orchards. This soaring spring festival is a perfect time to explore the farm during one of its most beautiful seasons, May 2 and May 3 from 10 a.m.-5 p.m.

Children can use their imaginations to make and decorate their own kites. We use a kite design that is guaranteed to fly! Choose from a colorful assortment of pre-made kites in the form of birds, butterflies, diamonds and more. Or bring your favorite kite from home. There will be a rainbow of colors in every shape and size floating through the air above our orchards.

Listen to the sounds of Bakersfield on Saturday and Mike & Laura on Sunday as your kite dances in the wind; music will play from 12 p.m.-4 p.m.

Have a great time playing on the farm. Take a wagon ride around the farm 11 a.m.-3 p.m. (subject to weather). Join in the fun of old-fashioned games and children's activities in the barnyard. Tic Tac Toe, hula hoop horses, bean bag apple basket toss, Bubble Station and much more. Our special children's playhouses will be open, Junior Mechanic Shop Little Tikes Farm Store and Discovery Barn. Don't miss the Hippity Hop Corral, taking a duck for Duckie Race or a pony ride. Play on our play tractors



and take a spin on the pedal tractor track. Our sheep shearer will visit our sheep in the barnyard on Sunday for their annual trim.

Handweavers of Bucks County will be demonstrating and selling their handiwear 10 a.m.-4 p.m. both days — Weaving, Spinning, Basketry, Rug Hooking, Felting — see how these crafts are made and take the amazing artisan works home!

Hungry kite fliers will find farm fresh lunch and snacks at the Farm Food Pavilion, filled with spring menu items, country style chili, and fresh baked pies. Our famous apple cider donuts and fresh pressed apple cider make every visit to the farm complete. Stop in the Barn Door Café for hand scooped ice cream and apple cider slush.

In our Wine Orchard, Terhune's own 18 varieties of wine are available for tasting under the 100-year-old apple trees. Tasting flights, wine by the glass and wine slushy will be available to toast Spring.

Strawberry picking begins in late May and usually lasts 2-3 weeks depending on the weather. Easy to pick for all ages, it is a great, fun family activity. Our juicy strawberries are grown on raised beds, with plastic to keep away weeds and wood chip mulch down the rows for easy walking.

The Lawrence Historical Society recently selected Pam as the inaugural recipient of the Robert B. Immordino Award. Pam was chosen due to her role in helping make Lawrence Township a vibrant, sustainable, and historic place to live. Among her many accomplishments, the board noted numerous achievements, including serving on the Lawrence Township Council and as Mayor; founding organizations, such as The Lawrence Township Community Foundation, The Lawrence Township Education Foundation, Sustainable Lawrence, and Farmers Against Hunger; creating the Lawrence Nature Center. Congratulations Pam on this well-deserved recognition and all you have done for Lawrence.

New Jersey Agricultural Society awarded Gary posthumously the Gold Medallion Award, the Society's highest honor, presented to individuals who have dedicated their lives to New Jersey agriculture and made significant contributions to the industry. "We will miss him dearly and will do our very best to carry on his legacy," said daughter Tannwen in accepting the award.

Important to our family is continuing to support the agricultural community and organizations that our parents and farm have been a part of. Gary was on the Board of Directors of the International Fruit Tree Association for 40 years. Reuwei was asked to speak at their annual conference this past winter on retail fruit operations.

Tannwen was voted into Gary's seat at the Trenton Farmer's Market Board of Directors as Vice President. At the current location since 1948, there is rich history, and a lot of continued growth opportunities at the Spruce Street Market. Terhune's stand at the market is open year-round and is a wonderful location for all your favorite farm fresh goodies.

Spring Green Vegetables

Green is the color of spring and that is certainly true at Terhune Orchards. A staple for healthy eating in many local families, our greens are available all year round. With spring sunshine, our leafy vegetables are especially plentiful. In the spring, harvesting of our head lettuce, baby lettuce, and mixed greens is transitioned to the high tunnels, and fields through the variable spring weather.



Terhune's mixed greens are a treat that includes a mild, sweet, and spicy variety of red mustard, green mustard, Chinese cabbage, pac choi, and tatso to provide a fresh balanced flavor. Our delicate baby lettuce mix includes eight varieties of sweet, crisp red and green butter lettuce, and oak leaf. Over years of multiple trials, Terhune's head lettuce types have been selected carefully, taking many factors into consideration. We have chosen the best flavors and range of varieties which are best suited to our growing conditions.



While lettuce is the main green on the farm, our asparagus is the first pick-your-own vegetable crop each spring signaling that spring has truly arrived. Asparagus is available as pick-your-own or freshly cut in our farm store daily. Luscious spring greens at Terhune Orchards also include spinach, kale, arugula, herbs, swiss chard, and radishes. Come see what Spring has to offer as new crops come in!

In Memoriam: Gary Bernard Mount

May 14, 1944 - December 29, 2025

Gary Bernard Mount died peacefully at his home, Terhune Orchards, Princeton, NJ on Monday, December 29 following a courageous battle with glioblastoma brain cancer. He was known for his generosity, his impact on the agricultural community and his deep love of family.

Born in Princeton, NJ in 1944, to Bernard Mount and Lillian Meyer Mount, Gary was a life-long Princeton resident. Growing up on Mount Farms, located along Route 1, Gary and his three brothers had many adventures living along the canal on a working apple orchard.


Gary went to Princeton High School where he met his future wife, Pam. He then went on to attend Princeton University where he graduated magna cum laude in 1966. Gary and Pam married in 1967 and subsequently spent three transformative years as Peace Corps volunteers in Micronesia, in the South Pacific.

Upon their return, they purchased the 55-acre Terhune Orchards in Princeton. At the time, no one had bought farmland in the area to actively farm in decades, but they were determined to build a thriving, working retail farm. It was important to Gary to pursue a career and lifestyle that allowed him to spend as much time as possible with his children as they grew up.

Their hard work and vision paid off. Today, Terhune Orchards has grown into a successful 250-acre retail farming operation that helped ignite the community-based farming movement and has become a beloved destination in Central New Jersey for generations of families.

Gary was a visionary and driving force over the last 50 years for the agricultural and local community. In the early 1980s, through New Jersey Future, Gary spearheaded a grassroots effort that led to passage of the Farmland Preservation Act of 1982. The act enabled farmers to sell their development rights to the state, local government, or a conservation group with a deed restriction limiting future use of the property to farming. Today, a third of New Jersey farmland — including all of Terhune Orchards 250 acres — is preserved in this way.

He was active in securing funding for preservation of the Watershed Organic Farm and served on the board of the Stony Brook-Millstone Watershed Association. He was also a commissioner of the New Jersey Water Supply Authority. In addition to his role in preserving farmland and open space, Gary was an impactful leader in many New Jersey agricultural organizations, including the state and Mercer County

boards of agriculture, the Mercer County Soil Conservation District, the Trenton Farmers' Market board, the Howell Living History Farm founding trustee and board, Princeton Agricultural, NJ State Horticultural Assn, president and treasurer; International Fruit Tree Assn, trustee. In 2005, American Fruit Grower Magazine named him Apple Grower of the Year, and in 2012 the International Fruit Tree Association inducted him into its Hall of Fame. He was a mentor to many new and younger farmers, always welcoming and giving advice.

An avid learner his whole life, Gary strove to find new ways to grow crops, new technologies to implement, and always looked for a new challenge or innovation.

Outside of agriculture, Gary was active in the local rowing community. He served as captain, and then treasurer, of the Carnegie Lake Rowing Association for over 25 years, and his passion for rowing remained a central part of his life. A member of the great Princeton Class of 1966, Gary enjoyed hosting annual class dinners and maintained life-long friendships with his college roommates and classmates.

A devoted father and grandfather, Gary cherished time with his children and grandchildren, planting trees with them on the farm, attending school and sport functions and teaching them about farm life at every opportunity. He also shared his love of travel through family trips and his annual trips with his brothers.

Gary is survived by his wife of 58 years, Pamela Hazenhal Mount; his daughters, Reuwai M. Hanewald, Tannwen E. Mount, who now manage and operate the farm, and their respective spouses Michael S. Hanewald, James H.B. Washburn; and his grandchildren: Maya M. Hanewald, Sasha M. Hanewald, Tess M. Hanewald, Becket M. Washburn, Clayton M. Washburn, Hadley M. Washburn; also survived by son, Mark B. Mount, and brothers Lee Mount, Timothy Mount, and many beloved nieces, nephews, cousins and relatives. He was predeceased by his brother, William Mount.
