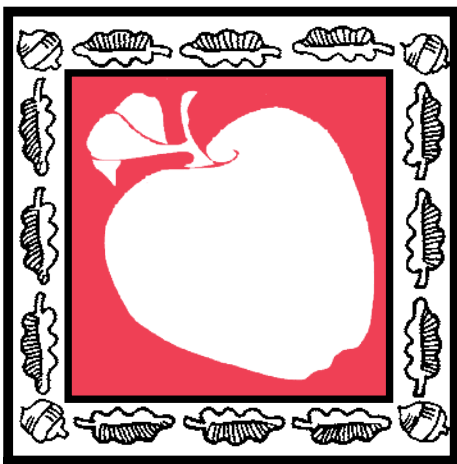

Pick Your Own pumpkins are fall favorites at the farm. Homegrown pumpkin patch will be filled with pumpkins of all sizes and colors including fun gourds. Have fun decorating your own pumpkin at the pumpkin painting station. Painting is included in fall admission with the purchase of a pumpkin.

Our flower garden is blooming all season. Fill your flower cups with colorful varieties of zinnia, marigold, snapdragons and more. Statice, gomphrena, ageratum, verbena, winged everlasting, strawflowers can be dried and enjoyed all year!

Vegetable picking is new this season. Pick a medley tomatoes (heirloom, plum, grape, cherry and slicer varieties), peppers (hot, mild and sweet



varieties), sweet corn and other assorted veggies throughout the fall.

Corn picking - sweet corn (multiple plantings keep fresh all season) fiesta ornamental corn and popcorn ready for picking this fall season. Great fun for decoration and popping!



Pumpkins, pumpkins, pumpkins!

In our homegrown pumpkin patch have fun picking your own pumpkin! Discover a variety of sizes, colors and shapes, from small gourds and jack-be-littles to large perfect for jack-o-lanterns and fun-colored stackers! During Family Fun Fall Weekends, paint your own pumpkin for free (with the purchase of a pumpkin) using kid friendly, washable paint.



Gobble Up Local & Fresh Thanksgiving Dishes

Surround your Thanksgiving turkey with a cornucopia of side dishes and desserts made from vegetables and fruit grown right here at Terhune Orchards. Our own array of colorful squashes — acorn, sweet dumpling, delicata, butternut make wonderful festival dishes. Greens are abundant for sides and salads, kale, broccoli, spinach, lettuces and Brussel sprouts.

Our freshly pressed apple cider and Terhune’s own wines are the perfect drinks for a locally-sourced Thanksgiving dinner.

For the main event-dessert! We have over 15 varieties of pies including your holiday favorites-pumpkin and apple. Mount family recipe — our deep-dish apple crisps, fruit breads, and cookies.

The farm store is open late until 7 p.m. on Wed. Nov. 26 for your Thanksgiving shopping. On Thanksgiving Day, the store is open from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m.



Bountiful Flowers all Fall

Terhune Orchards has hundreds of types of flowers. Our herb garden, flower gardens, and wildflowers all provide habitat for pollinators. Pollinators are important for many crops here on the farm. Diverse fields of flowers are a win-win for farmers, pollinators and visitors!



Our **pollinator trail** is through a field planted with cover crop to enrich the soil, attract pollinators and be enjoyed by visitors. Our pollinator trail is planted with biotiller medley cover crop. It contains sun hemp, oats, buckwheat, sunflowers, and diakon radish.

Wildflower path: we choose one field every year to host our wildflower path. We plant a variety of wildflower seeds as a cover crop (not harvested) to help rebuild our soils and support natural biodiversity with habitat and food. The flowers provide pollen, nectar and shelter for hundreds of important species, including butterflies and bees.

Enjoy strolling through these fields this season.

Behind the Scenes: Squeezed Apples

When our parents purchased Terhune Orchards in 1975, it grew three crops: apples, peaches and pears. Across from the current farm store (then called the Apple Barn) was the Cider Building (now our bakery), which housed a cider press. This was an older style rack and cloth press, a huge machine with big hydraulics, very impressive to us little kids.

Reuwai was an early taste tester as the blend of apples was perfected, not always



a welcomed job. But perfected it was. Dad would say a cider maker can't divulge their blend but here at Terhune Orchards, you can be sure we always have a mix that includes our favorite heritage apple, Staymen Winesap. We usually have a minimum of three varieties, Staymen Winesap and a sweeter apple, but usually more. Each batch varies depending on the time of year. Now that we have our controlled atmosphere storage, a special apple storage to keep apples crunchy and fresh year-round, we are able to make apple cider all year.

One of our early jobs as kids was to fill cider jugs at the cider barn using a tube and control handle. If you got really fast you could fill four gallons at a time without overflowing. People could bring back a jug to "refill" for 10 cents off!

As we modernized, we moved from the old fashion stack press with the folding cloth to a hydraulic press for efficiency, greater food safety and maintenance. All of our cider is flash pasteurized and put in cooling tanks

that have stirring bars (originally designed for milk but work great for cider too) so it all gets cooled quickly. With our modern bottling line, the next generation is out of a job of hand jugging cider.

Our next project is sparkling cider in cans and hard cider. Keep on pressing!

Picked daily, leafy greens, 5 kinds of lettuce, kales, mixed and baby greens — packed with fiber, antioxidants, vital nutrients and grown safely in our fields. As we turn to cooler weather, the root crops and hardy vegetables thrive. The store will be filled with broccoli, cabbage, carrots, beets and Brussel sprouts. Estate Wines from Terhune Orchards Vineyard and Winery

September and October are busy months here in the vineyards and winery. The vines are heavy with grapes ready to harvest. After hand harvesting, the grapes are de-stemmed before being pressed. Next the juice moves to the large stainless steel fermentation tanks and closely monitored. Finally, they are bottled and labeled, all right here on the farm.



Our estate-grown grapes produce 18 red and white wines that will please every palate. From full-bodied reds, to dry whites, to semi-sweet and fruit wines Terhune offers varieties everyone is sure to enjoy.

Enjoy our wines by the glass or tasting flights, located in the warmer season in our 100-year-old apple orchard and in cooler weather in our wine barn among our wine tanks. Seasonally choose refreshing wine slushy or a cup of hot mulled

wine (beginning mid-November). Light fare of cheese plates and homemade salsa and chips are available in the winery.

Winery Trivia nights continue, test your knowledge Thursdays 5-8 p.m., September 10 and, October 22. Please visit us November 27, 28 and 29 as part of the Garden State Wine Growers Association Holiday Wine Trail Weekend! The winery is open Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays. Our wines are available every day in the farm store, at the Trenton Farmers Market and online at terhuneorchards.com.

Admission tickets are required to access the winery on Fall Family Fun Weekends, no tickets required on Fridays or after our festival season.
